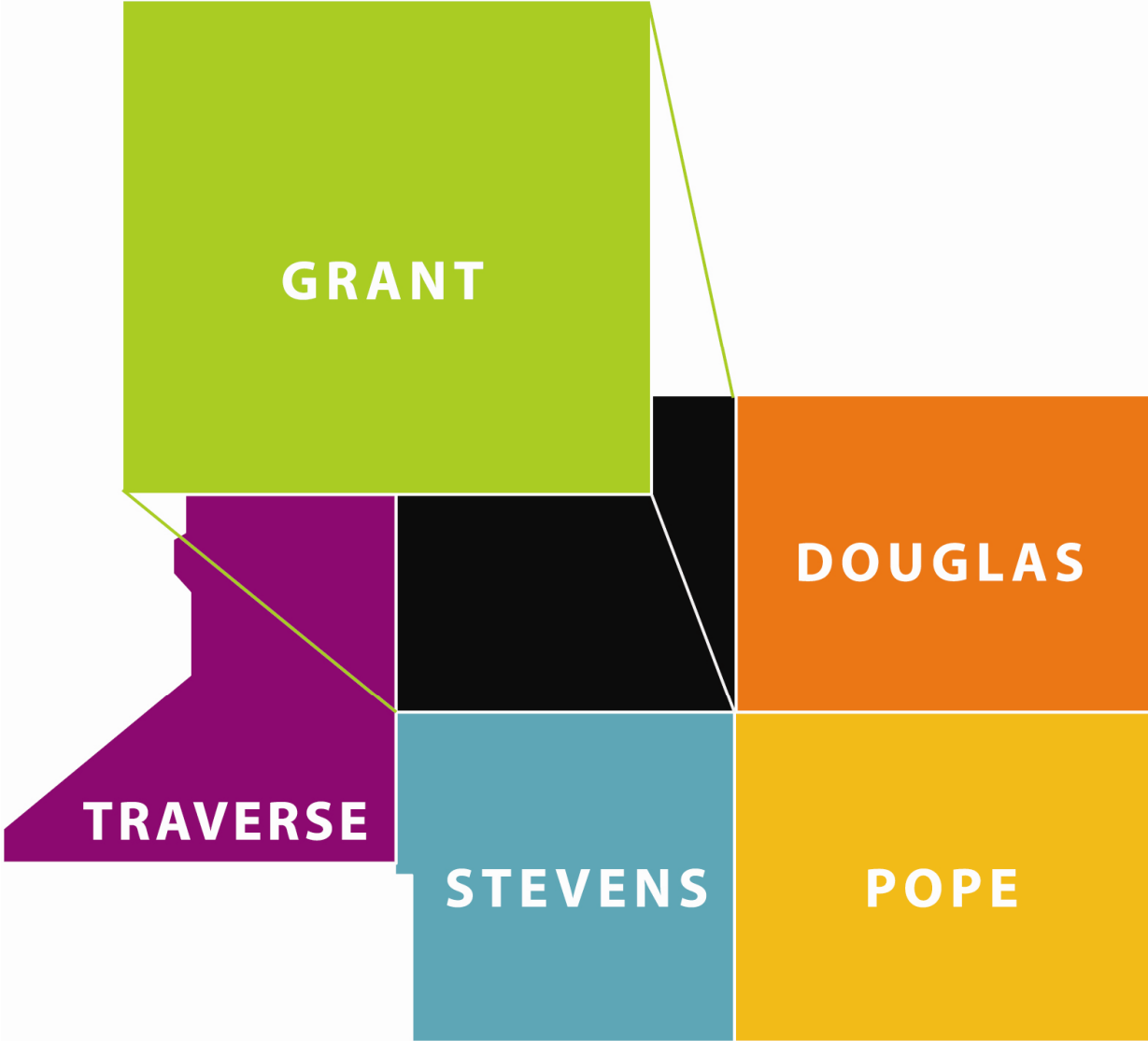

Kindergarten Connection is a child only Preschool/School Readiness program for children 4 - 5 years of age. These child only classes are designed to build social skills, introduce children to routines and pre-academic skills and prepare children for kindergarten.

Summary of Services

Mission: To Promote and Protect the Health of Individuals, Families, and Communities Through our Leadership.

The Stevens Traverse Grant Public Health offers a variety of services to meet the mental health needs of the community.

Child and Teen Check-ups: A comprehensive health examination by a Public Health Nurse or Registered Nurse for children from birth up to age 21, who are enrolled in Medical Assistance and Minnesota Care. This includes a social-emotional screening and assessment.

Family Home Visiting: Home visits by a Public Health Nurse or Registered Nurse for a variety of reasons and are tailored to fit the needs of the client:

- During pregnancy to provide education and support for a healthy baby.
- After delivery to provide education about growth & development, physical assessment, emotional and developmental screening, breastfeeding support, postpartum depression screening.
- For young children, to provide education about growth & development, and “early identification” developmental and social-emotional screening.

WIC: A nutrition program that helps families eat well and stay healthy, which in turn enhances emotional health and well-being. It includes nutrition education, one-on-one counseling about nutrition, vouchers to buy healthy foods, support with breastfeeding, information about health care, immunizations, and other programs. As part of the nutritional history, participants are screened for tobacco, alcohol and other drug use, and referred as needed. Information is provided on the risks of chemical use during pregnancy.

Follow Along Program: Is a state-wide program that helps you know if your child is playing, talking, growing, moving, and acting like other children the same age. Questionnaires are mailed to the parent or caregiver at specific ages in the child’s development, and then returned to the agency. A Public Health Nurse reviews the returned questionnaire and provides feedback on the results if there are any concerns. Information is also provided in the mailings about teaching new activities and what ages to teach them.

Kids Against Tobacco & Catalyst: These two programs provide the opportunity for an Adolescent Health Educator from the Public Health Department, in conjunction with the area school systems, to work with teens regarding issues that surround tobacco use. Catalyst students are provided with the education and tools they need to create their own campaigns against tobacco use and advocate for healthier choices. Self-esteem building is a natural component in the process of working together with issues that face young adults.

Personal Care Assistance (PCA) Assessments: It provides services to people who need help with activities of daily living, instrumental activities of daily living and health –related functions. PCA may be provided through hands-on assistance, supervision, cueing, redirection and intervention for behavior including monitoring and observation. A Public Health Nurse performs the assessment necessary to determine if a person is eligible for PCA services and provides information on providers in the area.

Complex Case Management partnering with Social Services: A Public Health Nurse works with members of Prime West who have special or complex situations that would benefit from case management.

Referral and Follow-up:

Information and referral to other agencies or professionals as needed.
